E safety

As Christmas approaches, many children may be asking Father Christmas for new phones, tablets and other devices. If they are lucky enough to receive these type of gifts, it is really important to make sure they are used safely by your children. Here are some things you might want to think about:

- Screen time How long do you think is reasonable for your child to spend on their device? Too long can be damaging to children's health and wellbeing. Many devices have settings which mean they will lock after a certain amount of time.
- Child lock settings Some games and apps are not suitable for all children, therefore it is really useful to set up passwords in the App Store and to block certain websites.
- Using the device in a safe place It can be difficult to monitor your child's device use if they take it into their bedroom. Having a 'downstairs only' rule can be really useful in ensuring your child's safety.
- Talk to your children Educating your child is the most effective way to keep them safe online. Let them know what is and isn't acceptable, and talk to them about what to do if something makes them feel worried, scared or confused.

PE and Sport Update

A big well done to our children who recently participated in the Athletics competitions. Our Y5/6 team came tenth, which is an improvement of five places from last year. Even more impressive, our Y3/4 team finished in 4th place – an improvement of ten places from last year!
