# School Improvement Update

Hemlington Hall Academy is always buzzing with excitement and busy learners, with dedicated and passionate staff who provide a broad and balanced curriculum to engage and stimulate the children we care so dearly about. Our results show that children make good progress, and we continue to work hard to increase the number of children who achieve in line with age related expectations and beyond across the whole school: this includes children achieving Good Levels of Development in Reception; those passing the phonics screening check in Year 1; and children in Year 2 and Year 6 who complete the end of key stage assessments (SATs). May we thank parents and carers for the continued support you provide in regards to your children's learning, particularly those who ensure their children maintain a good level of attendance. Our current attendance figure is 95.2%, which is below our minimum target of 96%. Each and every learning opportunity is important; make sure your child doesn't miss out!

YouTube is used over a billion times each day, and so many of our children want to be 'YouTubers' when they're older – but how can you keep them safe when using the app or website right now?

- YouTube has set up 'YouTube Kids', a <u>child-friendly version of the app</u> where you can even set a time limit to control screen time.
- You can turn on <u>'restricted mode'</u> which automatically blocks any videos that contain inappropriate content that children should not be exposed to. To turn restricted mode on, just go to the settings menu in the app or on the website.
- Turn on **parental controls** through your wifi. Parental controls usually let you set a light, medium or strict filter (or sometimes a custom filter) to help you protect your children from inappropriate content, including a section where you can block specific websites.

Sometimes certain content can sneak through these filters and controls, but remember it is important to speak to your children about staying safe online and what they should do if they find something upsetting or inappropriate.

### PE and Sport Update

This half term in PE all of our children are focussing on dance and learning a full routine to perform to the rest of their class. This will involve a lot of working together to develop control and confidence.



The new year also brings along a new football tournament! Our boys team was at the Lingfield Football tournament on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> January, before the girls team attended the tournament on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> January. We were so proud of our teams in the last tournament, and are rooting for them once again!
