English

Maths

Science

Our Science topic this half term is 'Living Things and Their Habitats' which we will cover through our work in

'Out in the Wilds'. Children need to know the seven life processes which all living things

demonstrate, 'MRS GREN' will help them with this. Ask your child about her!

<u>Spellings</u>

New spellings will be sent home on Fridays,



Friday. We will follow the Year 4 'Spell Zoo' programme where we will find word lists based on homophones and a variety of prefixes and suffixes.

Reading Records

We expect children to read at least three times per week at home, but ideally every day. Reading books can be changed on any day and reading records are checked on Thursdays for evidence of reading.

Homework


Homework is collected on Thursdays and new homework set the same day. If absent or any additional copies are required, children must collect copies from our 'spares' tray.
