Save 10% on School Uniform!

Our school uniform is a Royal Blue sweatshirt, cardigan or jumper worn with black or grey trousers / skirt. Summer gingham dresses for girls should be blue / white and shirts, blouses or polo shirts should be pale blue or white. Children should wear black, sensible school shoes.

1. Set up parental controls to block upsetting or harmful content, in-app purchases and how long your child can spend online – remember that **you** are in charge!

2. Restrict payment methods in all games and apps – even 'free to play' games like Fortnite have the opportunity to make in-game purchases, which can add up very quickly!

3. Prevent your children from talking to strangers by turning off voice chat features (usually found in the 'Settings' menu of a game).

4. Encourage children to create a 'strong' password: a combination of upper/lower case letters, numbers and symbols. Remind your child that their password is not to be shared with others.

5. Show your child how to make a report if they feel another player is behaving inappropriately, for example through CEOPS. You can find out more about CEOPS at <u>https://www.ceop.police.uk/safety-centre/</u>

6. And most importantly, talk to your children about staying safe – have regular discussions about what is acceptable from them and from others, and what to do if they feel something isn't right.
