


Hemlington Hall Academy

On Thursday 8th November representatives from our school attended the memorial service at the cenotaph in honour of those who fought to protect us in wars past, many giving their lives to save the lives of others.



As part of the First World War Centenary (one hundred years since the end of the First World War), children took part in a special history day on Friday 9th November. Children learnt about important memories, remembering special events, the significance of the poppy and – in upper school – some of the key events that took place at the end of the First World War.





Sing a song of sixpence...

On Monday 19th November our children in Nursery and Reception will be celebrating World Nursery Rhyme week, singing as many nursery rhymes as possible.

Can you beat 96%?

The minimum attendance level which is expected for all primary aged children nationally is 96%. Good attendance is very important so that children are given as much opportunity as possible to develop academically and socially. When children are absent from school they often find it difficult to catch up on the work they have missed and can feel unsettled by this.

To promote good attendance, we are introducing a new termly 'Traffic Light' system: at the end of term, we will be sending out attendance certificates and reports on coloured paper to inform you of your child's attendance level.

A green certificate means that your child has attendance that is at or above the government's expectation of 96%.

An **amber report** means that although your child's attendance is not yet 'concerning' it is between 92.1% and 96%, and some improvement is required.

A **red report** means that your child has a significant number of absences and is at risk of underachieving as a result. We would ask for your support in ensuring that attendance improves as we monitor any further absences, and we may invite you into school to discuss this further.

Please see our 'School Attendance – New Traffic Light System' leaflet for more information (which is available on our school website). By working together to improve attendance, we can ensure our children are given the best opportunities to succeed.
