Top ten e-safety tips!

1) Don't post any personal information online – like your address, email address or mobile number.

2) Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you've put a picture of yourself online most people can see it and may be able to download it; it's not just yours anymore.

- 4) Never give out your passwords.
- 5) Don't friend people you don't know.
- 6) Speak to your parent or carer about people you meet online who suggest you meet up.
- 7) Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are.
- 8) Think carefully about what you say before you post something online.

9) Respect other people's views: even if you don't agree with someone else's views it doesn't mean you need to be rude.

10) If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website, turn off your computer if you want to and tell a trusted adult immediately.

Let's keep everyone safe!
