Homework at Hemlington Hall Academy

May we say a huge thank you to all those who provided really useful feedback about homework, and congratulations to the winner of the prize draw! Here are the key findings from what you told us:

- 86% of parents felt that asking children to read at least three times each week was the right amount of reading homework.
- Around a third of parents and carers felt that asking children to practise their spellings/key words and maths facts each night was too much homework.
- Almost half of parents and carers would like school to set research tasks for the children to complete about their current topic.
- Lots of parents and carers requested more support to allow them to better help their children with their school work.

So, how are we acting on your feedback?

- 1. We would now like to ask children to read, practise their spellings/key words and practise their maths facts at least three times a week (but the more the better!).
- 2. Before starting a new topic, children will be given a research task to complete about it so they come to school with some ideas ready; this could be some written notes, a poster or even a presentation. Children will be awarded house points for their research.
- 3. Staff are in the process of putting support materials and workshops in place to further support parents and carers to better help their children, such as what questions to ask when reading, how to apply spelling rules to words and how to work things out in maths.
