
Relative Pronouns and Embedded Clause

Do you want to add some interesting information to your sentences? Try putting an extra information clause in the middle to make a complex sentence. You will need to replace the **subject** with a <u>relative pronoun</u>.

Look at this example, which shows you how to do it:



Rearrange each pair of sentences so the relative pronoun (who/which) and extra information clause are in the middle. Write the new complex sentence in your book.



- 1) Jellyfish have no bones at all. *They* live in the sea. (which)
- 2) Daniel Radcliffe is a very famous actor. *He* played Harry Potter. (who)
- 3) Polar bears have translucent fur. *They* only live in the Arctic. (which)
- 4) My brother is always mean to me. *He* is two years older. (who)
- 5) Phillip Pullman is my favourite writer. *He* wrote Clockwork. (who)
- 6) I like marmalade on toast for breakfast. *Marmalade* is a sweet spread. (which)
- 7) Your PE kit has your name on it. Your PE kit is on the floor. (which)
- 8)Class 3H are having a special treat. *They* all have 100% attendance. (who)
- 9) The Tooth Fairy lives in an ivory castle. *She* is friends with Santa. (who)
- 10) I try to eat lots of fresh vegetables every day. *Vegetables* are good for you. (which)
