

Relative Pronouns and Embedded Clause

Do you want to add some interesting information to your sentences? Try putting an extra information clause in the middle to make a complex sentence. You will need to replace the **subject** with a relative pronoun.

Look at this example, which shows you how to do it:

First simple sentence
(Main clause)

Extra information simple sentence
(Subordinate clause)

Relative pronoun

That woman is our teacher Miss Khan.

She is very kind to everyone.

who

That woman

who is very kind to everyone

is our teacher Miss Khan.

Don't forget your commas!

Rearrange each pair of sentences so the relative pronoun (**who/which**) and extra information clause are in the middle. Write the new complex sentence in your book.

- 5) Phillip Pullman is my favourite writer. **He** wrote Clockwork. (**who**)
- 6) I like marmalade on toast for breakfast. **Marmalade** is a sweet spread. (**which**)
- 7) Your PE kit has your name on it. **Your PE kit** is on the floor. (**which**)
- 8) Class 3H are having a special treat. **They** all have 100% attendance. (**who**)
- 9) The Tooth Fairy lives in an ivory castle. **She** is friends with Santa. (**who**)
- 10) I try to eat lots of fresh vegetables every day. **Vegetables** are good for you. (**which**)
