

- A large artificial reservoir in North East England.
- The largest artificial lake in the UK (based on capacity).
 Over 27 miles of shore line.
- Holds 200 billion litres.

Why was it built?


In the 1960s there was a rise in demand for water in this area so the reservoir was created. Kielder forest was built around it which happens to be the largest man-made woodland in the UK. It is a very popular tourist attraction with many activities available including water sports, walking and cycling tracks. An observatory has also been built there.
