San Francisco

Golden Gate Bridge

The Golden Gate Bridge is a suspension bridge spanning the Golden Gate, the one mile wide strait connects San Francisco Bay and the Pacific Ocean. The structure links the American city of San Francisco, California - the northern tip of the San Francisco Peninsula - to Marin County, carrying both U.S. Route 101 and California State Route 1 across the strait. The bridge is one of the most internationally recognized symbols of San Francisco, California, and the United States. It was initially designed by engineer Joseph Strauss in 1917. It has been declared one of the Wonders of the Modern World by the American Society of Civil Engineers. Local legend says that by the time it has finished being painted, it's time to start at the beginning again!
